Where is Pitcairn located?

It comprises the islands of Pitcairn, Henderson, Ducie and Oeno. Pitcairn, the only inhabited island, is a small volcanic outcrop situated in the South Pacific at latitude 25.04 south and longitude 130.06 west. It is roughly 2170km (1350 miles) east south-east of Tahiti and just over 6600km (4100 miles) from Panama.

Henderson Island accounts for 86% of the land area, but only Pitcairn Island is inhabited. The inhabited islands nearest to the Pitcairn Islands are Mangareva (of French Polynesia), 688 km to the west, [note 2] as well as Easter Island, 1,929 km to the east.

How to get to Pitcairn?

Nearest airport: Mangareva Airport, (Gambier Islands) Route: First fly from the major airports in Auckland, Los Angeles or Tokyo to Tahiti. From Tahiti, take a flight to Mangareva, with Air Tahiti being the only airline servicing this route. From Mangareva, you can book a cargo ship or other vessels to reach Pitcairn.
