What is the Italian name of Vatican City?

The Italian name of the city is Città del Vaticanoor,more formally,Stato della Città del Vaticano,meaning 'Vatican City State'. Its Latin name is Status Civitatis Vaticanae; this is used in official documents by the Holy See,the Church and the Pope.

When did Vatican City become a sovereign state?

In 1929,the Lateran Treaty,agreed between the Pope and Mussolini's government,officially established Vatican City as an independent sovereign state. Today,the Vatican City is the world's smallest nation.
